1. <u>Philip Edgecumbe Hughes</u>:

The Septuagint, which our author echoes, has 'he pleased God' instead of 'he walked with God'; but this is not to say something different, since only he who pleases God walks with God, that is, enjoys a relationship of harmonious fellowship with him.

2. Kent Hughes:

The preacher is saying that faith precedes and produces the walk with God that so pleases him... In other words, if we are not living a life of faith, we cannot be pleasing to God. We cannot have God's smile on our lives without faith.

3. John MacArthur:

- Believing that the true God exists is what is pleasing to Him. Mere recognition of a deity of some sort the "ground of being," the "man upstairs," or any of the man-made gods… is not the object of belief in mind here. Only belief in the existence of the true God, the God of Scripture, counts.
- Every good thing that God has, including eternal life, constitutes the reward for belief. For faith we receive forgiveness, a new heart, eternal life, joy, peace, love, heaven everything! When we trust in Jesus Christ, we become mutual heirs with Him. All that God's own Son has is ours as well.

Certainly there is a God. Any man who doesn't believe in a cosmic force is a fool, but we could never know Him.
