## 1. Kent Hughes:

- Israel's deliverance began with an obscure couple believing God in the midst of darkness.
- So, rather than embracing Egypt's evanescent pleasures, Moses consciously "chose to be mistreated along with the people of God." Moses believed that Israel stood in unique relationship with the living God and had a unique role to play in world history. Moses chose the most exciting path he could possibly take. To him, life in the brilliance of the Egyptian court was a dull, ignoble thing when compared with the society of mistreated Israel.

## 2. <u>Charles Spurgeon</u>:

Moses showed the reality of his faith in his life, by what he refused to do, and by what he chose to do. Both the negative and the positive poles were made right by his faith. Everything about Moses proved the truth and the vigor of his faith in God.
